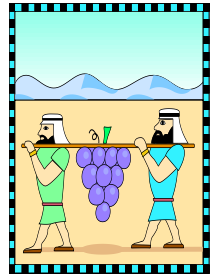

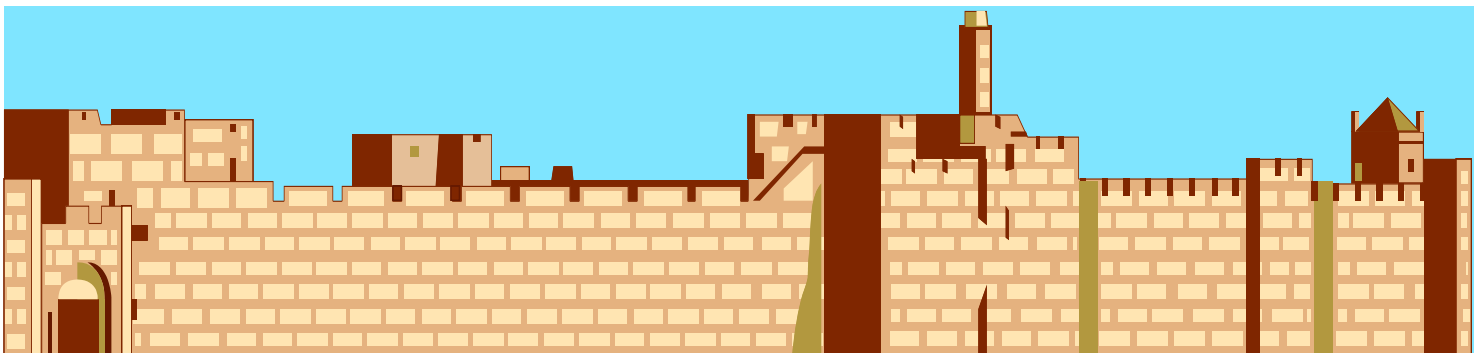

DINIM FOR TISHA B'AV
 MONDAY EVENING, AUGUST 8TH AND TUESDAY, AUGUST 9TH, 2011

- On Tisha B'Av, five things are forbidden: Eating and drinking, washing, anointment, the wearing of leather shoes and cohabitation.
- This year the Tisha B'Av fast begins on Monday Eve, August 8th at 8:04 PM.
- All are required to fast on Tisha B'Av
- Washing for pleasure is forbidden both in warm and in cold water.
- Leather shoes may not be worn. Shoes of wood, linen or rubber are permissible. But if they are covered by leather or if they have leather soles, they are prohibited.
- Everything that is prohibited on Tisha B'Av is prohibited from sunset Erev Tisha B'Av till the departure of Tisha B'Av the following night.
- After Shmoneh Esreh, on Monday Evening, the Book of Eichah is read, and on Tuesday morning "Kinos" is recited.
- Tefilin are not put on during Shachrit but are worn during Mincha; for the tefilin are called "glory," and on Tisha B'Av our glory was taken from us. During Mincha "talit" and "tefilin" are worn.
- The fast ends Tuesday Evening, August 9th at 8:37 PM.
- Nine Days: From August 1st - August 10th, we are not permitted to eat meat or chicken except for our Shabbos meals.



TISHA B'AV SCHEDULE OF SERVICES

Monday evening, August 8th Mincha will be at 8:00 PM.

Fast begins at 8:04 PM. Maariv and Aycha will be at 8:30 PM.

Tuesday, August 9th, services begin at 6:00 AM and will be followed by the reading of selected Kinus with explanation by Rabbi Mehlman.

Mincha will be at 7:30 PM (please bring your Tefilin and Tallis), followed by Maariv. Fast ends at 8:37 PM.

From Rabbi Daniel Mehlman

One day, a small opening appeared in a cocoon; a man sat and watched for the butterfly for several hours as it struggled to force its body through that little hole.

It appeared as if it had gotten as far as it could and it could not go any further. Then it seemed to stop making any progress.

So the man decided to help the butterfly; he took a pair of scissors and opened the cocoon. The butterfly then emerged easily.

But it had a withered body; it was tiny and had shriveled wings.

The man continued to watch because he expected that, at any moment, the wings would open, enlarge and expand, to be able to support the butterfly's body, and become firm.

Neither happened! In fact, the butterfly spent the rest of its life crawling around with a withered body and shriveled wings. It never was able to fly.

What the man, in his kindness and his goodwill did not understand, was that the restricting cocoon and the struggle required for the butterfly to get through the tiny opening, were God's way of forcing fluid from the body of the butterfly into its wings, so that it would be ready for flight once it achieved its freedom from the cocoon.

Sometimes, struggles are exactly what we need in our life. If God allowed us to go through our life without any obstacles, it would cripple us. We would not be as strong as we could have been. Never been able to fly.

“I asked for Strength...and God gave me difficulties to make me strong.

I asked for Wisdom...and God gave me problems to solve.

I asked for Prosperity...and God gave me a brain and brawn to work.

I asked for Courage...and God gave me obstacles to overcome.

I asked for Love...and God gave me troubled people to help.

I received nothing I wanted...but I received everything I needed.”
